

Types of Corrugated Boxes

Half-Slotted Type Boxes: Half- Slotted Containers (HSC) offer many different applications when storing transporting products. The bottoms flaps, which are identical in length, meet at the center of the box when folded. The top of the box does not have flaps in it, leaving it completely uncovered. HSCs are used for quick transports and storage bins.

Slotted Type Boxes: Regular Slotted Containers (RSC) is the most common style. Both top and bottom flaps are identical length and meet in the center when folded. If the product requires a flat surface while in the box, a fill-in-pad can be placed inside for extra support.


Telescope Type Box: A Telescope box consist of two separate pieces that fit over each other. The cover slides completely over the body, creating double and coverage and protection.

Folder Type Boxes & Trays: Folder Boxes and Trays consist of one piece. The bottom of the box is hinged from all sides to make a cover. When covered, it creates a closed box for added protection.

Slide Type Boxes: Slide Type boxes consist of several pieces of liners and sleeves sliding in different directions into each other. This group also includes outside sleeves for other cases.

Rigid Type Boxes: Rigid Type Boxes consist of two separate end pieces and a body and require stitching or glueing.

Partitions & Fold-Up Pads: Partitions and Fold-Up Pads are interior pieces such as inside liners, pads, separators, dividers, etc. They can be used as added protection for a product while in storage or transit.
